Regular balloons - \$10 for 15 balloons Mylar balloons - \$15 for 10 balloons Streamers - \$3 for a large roll (one color per roll) Flowers - \$10 a bunch, for centerpieces

ENTERTAINMENT

Band - \$100 for an hour DJ - \$50 for an hour Spotify Playlist - Free with occasional ads

REFRESHMENTS

Pizza - \$5 per person Cupcakes - \$3 per cupcake Sheet cake - \$25 for a cake that serves 20
